# EiE – Education for Children in Emergency

## Background:

Torrential rains along with incessant water flow of trans-boundary rivers of mid July 2016 in the north east part of Bangladesh caused flooding that left children and communities in massive sufferings. Around 3.7 million people across 19 districts of Bangladesh are affected by this year floods. The flood caused significant impact on livelihood, shelter, WASH and education sector. National Disaster Response Coordination Centre (NDRCC) reported that 38,000 shelter fully destroyed and 190,697 partially damaged. One of the most affected sector is education whereby more than 1500 schools are impacted and schooling is interrupted. These schools are either used as temporary shelters or are inundated.

## Project Objectives:

Objective 1: To ensure that children in the flood affected areas are able to re-start the schooling in earliest possible time

Objective 2: To strengthen disaster resilience and safety through awareness, capacity building, and advocacy on School Disaster Management (SDM).

## Expected Results:

R1: Selected school's education restored with the support from school management and education authorities.

R2: Students of the selected schools have access to education along with repaired WASH facilities

R3: The capacity of schools on School Disaster Management (SDM) activities are improved through training and advocacy.

**Target schools:** 20 most affected schools in Sirajgonj district (Sub district Chowhali) and Kurigram district (Sub district Ulipur)

**Target children:** 5,200 girls and boys approximately.

**Implementation and coordination:** The project will be implemented through SCI partner NGO Manab Mukti Sangstha (MMS) and Mohideb Jubo Samaj Kalyan Samity (MJSKS) who has prior experience to work in Education in Emergency.

**Duration:** 6 months (01 October 2016 to 31 March 2017)

- Repair and re-Construction of damage WASH facilities on emergency basis
- Continue the functionality of National Education Cluster and its sub chapter to coordinate disaster preparedness and response in education sector
- Disseminate and orient SMC on school emergency response guidelines (SOP, drill guidelines and key messages).
